KS1 / Year 1 Information Letter - Summer Term 2024



The aim of this letter is to provide a broad overview of the work we will be covering in our classes this term, along with information regarding routines, expectations etc. We hope this will enable you to prepare, support and reinforce your child's understanding in your discussions at home.

English

On-going throughout the term:

- Children will be supported to form each letter accurately and neatly.
- They will develop their basic rhyming skills.
- They will learn and use high frequency and common exception words
- They will continue to develop basic sentence structure capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.
- The children will have regular Phonics Lessons and Reading Sessions.
- The children will focus on reading real words and nonsense words.
- They will develop their basic reading comprehension skills.

Phonics

Children will be taught Phonics daily. This will involve learning and consolidating new phonemes and graphemes, to be used in reading and writing.

Phonemes/Graphemes:

- ay (play) / a-e (shake) / ea (each) / e (he)
- ie (pie) / i-e (time) / o (go) / o-e (home)
- ue (blue, rescue) / ew (chew, new) / u-e (rude, cute) / aw (claw)

- i (tiger) / a (paper) / ow (snow) / u (unicorn)
- ph (phone) / wh (wheel) / ie (shield) / g (giant)

<u>Maths</u>

- Measuring Non-standard measures and introducing simple standard measures.
- Multiplication and Division Equal or unequal groups and remainders.
- Multiplication Repeated addition and arrays (number of groups and size of groups).
- Multiplication Problem solving (identifying the number of groups and size of the group).
- Multiplication Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.
- Division Sharing and grouping problems.
- Time Telling the time, o'clock and half past.
- Fractions Sharing into equal groups.
- Fractions Equal or unequal parts of shapes.
- Fractions Continuous quantities including capacity.
- Numbers to 20 Review.
- Numbers to 100 Place value and digits, making 10s and some more.
- Place Value Partitioning numbers into 10s and 1s, estimation, ordering and comparison.

Foundation Subjects

Science - Plants

In this unit, the children will learn how to identify and name a variety of plants. They will also look at the basic structure of these living organisms and how they develop.

Science - Living Things

In this unit, the children will learn how to identify, name and describe a variety of animals such as: fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. They will also learn to classify animals into carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.

<u>History - How Did The First Flight</u> Change The World?

In this unit, the children will learn the story behind the first ever aeroplane flight, and explore the impact the aeroplane has had on the world we know today.

<u>Geography - What Will We See On</u> Our Journey Around The World?

In this unit, the children will take virtual journeys around the world. They will begin with our local area, then they will travel to coastal, rainforest, dry desert and world city locations.

French-PPA cover

In this unit the children will be learning about their families and the weather and learning to name them in French.

Art - PPA cover

In this unit, the children will explore different types printing skills, looking at differen types of homes and learning about line drawings.

Computing - We Are Storytellers

In this unit, the children will produce a recording using microphones and ipads that they can share with others.

PSHE - Relationships

In this unit, the children will learn how to identify and maintain good friendships. They will also consider the importance of respect and

English Genres

Narrative unit featuring 'Madlenka' by Peter Sis

In this unit, the children will explore aspects of another country and culture and compare these to their own experiences. They will learn to identify key events in a story through the use of a story map. They will also continue to use conjunctions.

Non Chronological Reports -Rainbow Fish

In this non-fiction unit, the children will explore the different types of fish. They will then research these animals in order to create a non chronological report.

Poetry

In this unit, the children will listen to, read and perform a range of poems, developing their poetry knowledge and creating their own versions of a style.

<u>Little Red and the Very Hungry</u> Lion

In this unit, the children will focus on recognising good and bad characters within a tale, identify tand use story language in a familiar story and retell it in their own words. They will focus on question marks and exclamation marks.

Comprehension

During this term, the children will continue comprehension lessons where they will learn the skills needed to read a text, understand the narrative and skim and retrieve to answer questions.

PSHE - Changing Me

In this unit, the children will learn the ways in which each of us is unique. They will also learn about the basic changes that occur as we develop from babies to adults.

PE - Dance (Moving Words)

In this unit, the children will explore interpreting action words, movements and phrases and performing them through physical actions.

PE - Games (Fundamentals Unit 2)

In this unit, the children will further develop the fundamental movement skills of: running, changing direction, catching, throwing, hitting a target.

Music

The children will be following an adapted Music Express scheme covering the following topics: Story Time (Sounds), Pattern (Beat), Animals and Water (Pitch).

Homework

Weekly homework will be uploaded to Seesaw each Friday. We cwill continue with weekly phonics. We will also alternate between English, Maths and a Foundation Subject. Once this has been completed at home, you will then need to upload a photo of your child's work by the following Thursday; this will enable it to be acknowledged and any necessary feedback given.

Reading

Although your child will be taught to read at school, you can have a huge impact on their reading journey by continuing to practise at home, preferably on a daily basis. There are two types of reading book that your child will bring home on a Friday:

- A fluency reading book. This will be at the correct phonic stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently.
- A sharing book. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.

Please return your child's fluency reading book and reading record, *signed by an adult*, the following Wednesday. Sharing books can also be returned on Wednesdays.

Year 1 Expectations

- Please send only water in a small, named plastic bottle with a sport spout.
- All children must have a pair of soft named indoor shoes which will remain in school.
